

The following acts are prohibited in the Hoover Wilderness:

-  Using a trail, campsite, or any other area by a group larger than 15 persons; traveling with more than 25 head of stock.
-  Camping within 100 feet of lake shore, streams, and trails (unless terrain prohibits) but not within 25 feet in any situation.
-  Discharging a firearm, air rifle, or gas gun except for emergencies, and taking of wildlife as permitted by State laws.
-  Cutting or damaging standing trees, live or dead.
-  Possessing or leaving refuse, debris, or litter in an exposed or unsanitary condition (including human waste).
-  Camping in a zone for more than 14 consecutive days.
-  Possessing or using a bicycle, wagon, cart, or other vehicle.
-  Possession of motorized and/or mechanized equipment including chainsaws.
-  Camping within 1/4 mile of Barney Lake for more than one consecutive night.
-  Camping within 100 feet of Barney lake.
-  Building, attending, maintaining or using a campfire or stove fire, except for a portable stove using gas, jellied petroleum or pressurized fuel within one-quarter mile of Barney and Peeler lakes, and above 9,000 feet within the Virginia and Green Creek drainages.
-  Camping at Red Lake, Blue Lake and Virginia Lake.

Additional Regulations for the Sawtooth Zone

-  Building, maintaining, or using a campfire (wood fires).
-  Using a campsite or area by a group larger than 8 persons.
-  Camping within 100 yards of established routes.
